ULTRASOUNDS FOR PATIENTS WITH CATHETERS

We have revised our directions for patients with Foley/indwelling catheters having a pelvis, abdomen/pelvis, kidney & bladder, or pelvis/KUB ultrasounds. Patients are advised to clamp the catheter 1.5 hours before the appointment and drink 1 litre of water. The patient should complete drinking all the water 1 hour prior to the appointment and keep the catheter clamped until the exam is complete. Patients will be provided with this direction as part of the booking process. Prep instructions can also be found at physicians.radiology.ca.

CPSS REGULATIONS

To ensure timely patient bookings and in line with CPSS regulations, requisitions must include full referrer details – your legible name, or verified electronic signature (if using EMR), billing code, clinic address, phone, and fax number. We cannot process requisitions or schedule exams without this information. We also require the health care number for the patient and the relevant history for the exam to be included on the requisition. Incomplete information will delay the processing of the requisition and the scheduling of the patient's exam.

STAY CURRENT WITH REQUISITIONS
